# **ADMISSION TO THE MAJOR**

First-year applicants must declare the major at the time of application to the College of Environmental Design (CED). However, current UC Berkeley students may apply to change colleges into CED if admission requirements are met and space is available. Transfer applicants must complete lower division college and major requirements prior to Berkeley to be considered for admission to CED.

The department offers a minor in **City Planning**. The minor is open to undergraduate students at UC Berkeley except those in the Urban Studies major.
